
Robinson Trust Funding Criteria



- Excludes previously planned projects
- Includes areas not likely to receive funding
- Excludes streets without curb and gutter
- Must be committed by October 2024

How projects were selected

- Every street evaluated for Trust funding criteria
- Projects already planned or likely to receive future funding were not included
- Qualifying streets ranked considering factors such as:
 - Safety: Addressing current unsafe conditions
 - Connectivity: Improving connectivity to adjacent sidewalks, trails, schools, parks, shopping areas, or public transportation
 - Level of usage, including vehicle volume and type of road



Expanding the Sidewalk Network

Original Process (2020 / 2021)

Planning (4 months)

- Neighborhood Input Survey
 - Public Meeting
 - TC Meeting

Engineering Study (4 months)

- TC Meeting

Design (4 months)

PublicMeeting

- TC Meeting

Construction (3 months)

- Coordinate with Residents

- Side of street determined by residential survey results
- Survey, 2 public meetings, 3 Council meetings
- Process was slow to advance projects only 3 projects in 2020-21

Early Survey Results

Overall Resident Input:


- Response Rate: 67%

- In favor: 44%

- Opposed: 56%


Public Comments/Concerns:

- No safety issues
- Light traffic
- Aesthetics
- Yes, but not my side of street
- Greatly needed addition



New Process: 1 Public Meeting, 3 Council Meetings

- 1. Select side of street based on engineering recommendations:
- Tree Impact
- Impact on other vegetation
- Grading Impacts
- Utilities and other physical constraints
- Level of connectivity to existing/planned sidewalk networks, other streets, and public amenities
- 2. Public meeting to present preliminary design
- 3. Work with residents on how to best address their concerns in the final sidewalk design on the selected side of street



* Connectivity Example: Walking directions to bus stop, or to Cunningham Park (Google Maps)


Accomplishments





- Starting Trust Fund balance: \$8M
- □ Total Planned: \$7.8M
- 29 Projects (5.1 miles) completed or in construction: \$6.5M
- 9 Projects (1 mile) currently in design phase: (\$1.3M)
 - These will be Spring 2024 Town Council Agenda Items to approve proposed construction
