SUBJECT: Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Coronavirus Relief Fund Memo #3

As you know, on April 16, 2020, Fairfax County submitted a request to receive direct payment from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Coronavirus Relief Fund. I would like to inform you that today we received the County's allocation from the U.S. Treasury Department. The payment is for the anticipated amount of \$200,235,484.90.

The amount that the County received is based on the County's population, which also includes the population of the towns of Clifton, Herndon, and Vienna. Staff has calculated the towns' share of the funding based on the latest available population figures from the U.S. Census Bureau as published by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service. The table below shows the amounts for each town. Last week we informed the towns about the funding and we will be transferring their portions promptly.

Staff has not yet received detailed guidance from the federal government about specific uses for the local funding and reporting requirements. However, staff continues to work on recommendations for initial uses of these funds, consistent with the broad guidelines for their use as outlined in the CARES Act.
