"WHEREAS, one of the early engagements of the Civil War took place in Vienna 100 years ago this month; and

"WHEREAS, the town council desires to commemorate this most dramatic event in the town's history in some permanent manner; and

"WHEREAS, the battle in Vienna in June 1861 was fought by the First Ohio Volunteers and the First South Carolina Volunteers, being the first land engagement for troops of both states; now, therefore,

"BE IT RESOLVED, that the name of Glyndon Street Park be changed to "Ohio Park", and the name of Meadow Lane Park be changed to "South Caroline Park"; and

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the town manager be directed to have suitable small wooden markers placed at the entrance to each park explaining briefly the origin of its name."

Councilman Ford moved adoption of the following resolution:

"WHEREAS, one of the early engagements of the Civil War took place in Vienna 100 years ago this month; and

"WHEREAS, the town council desires to commemorate this most dramatic event in the town's history in some permanent manner; and

"WHEREAS, the battle in Vienna in June, 1861, was fought by the First Ohio Volunteers and the First South Carolina Volunteers, being the first land engagement for troops of both states; now, therefore,

"BE IT RESOLVED, that the name of Glyndon Street Park be changed to "Ohio Park," and the name of Meadow Lane Park be changed to "South Carolina Park"; and,

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the town manager be directed to have suitable small wooden markers placed at the entrance to each park explaining briefly the origin of its name."

Councilman Pellegrino seconded.

Councilman Ford stated that he had submitted the resolution at this time because the nation is observing the Civil War Centennial and he feels that Vienna should join in the observance. He felt it would be well for Vienna to have some permanent means of marking its historical points, particularly for the young people of the Town.

Councilman Pellegrino moved to amend the resolution by adding to it: "Be it further resolved that the name of Lewis Street on the southwest side of Maple Avenue to Hurley Road be renamed Wade Hampton Drive" and that the Town Manager take the necessary action to erect the proper street signs thereto.

Councilman Ford seconded the amendment.

Councilman Pellegrino said that there were only three houses that would be effected by the change in name of the indicated portion of Lewis Street, and that Councilman Cowden had advised him that owners of these houses had no objection to the change in name of the street.

Councilman Ford, in answer to the Mayor's question, said that he had suggested that Meadow Lane Park be changed to South Carolina Park because the South Carolina troops came in that direction, and that he had suggested that Glyndon Park be renamed Ohio because it is on the northeast.

Mr. Robinson felt there should be more permanent markers than wooden signs.

Mr. Stenger pointed out that the Lewis family was one of the earliest families around Vienna. He felt it would be more appropriate to change some of the names in the new subdivisions which had no historical significance.

Councilman Cowden did not feel that there was a deep significance in renaming the parks for the Civil War Centennial. He questioned whether the Post Office Department should not be contacted and asked for comment. He also is opposed to the Town paying for changes in signs that would be necessary.

The Mayor requested the Clerk to poll the Council on the amendment:

FOR THE AMENDMENT TO THE RESOLUTION: Councilman Ford and Pellegrino.
