Timeline to Adoption

The Need to Update the Project Timeline

The Town Council has made great progress toward providing guidance that will lead to a draft document ready for formal referral to the Planning Commission and for releasing to the public for the public hearings. Certain topics, however, have required more time than was anticipated in previous versions of the project timeline, which were discussed with the Council. This memorandum describes the need to update the project timeline and, in combination with the attached updated draft calendar, discusses the draft changes and the factors taken into account.

The most important factor in driving the need for a timeline change is that the previous projected dates for the joint public hearings (Town Council and Planning Commission) no longer appear to be achievable. In the previous calendar, those dates were projected to be May 22 and May 24, 2023. As the Council has still not had an opportunity to review a complete draft of all articles, with updates stemming from the Council's guidance, the public hearings need to be postponed.

From Now to a Draft Released to the Public and Planning Commission

If the Council completes the topics raised at the May 1st meeting, staff proposes to return with a complete draft for a Conference Session after the June 5th meeting. (If the Council needs more time on these topics, staff can return on May 8th to complete them.) Staff needs the time until June 5th for two key reasons:

- The draft will include updates to all Articles and bring a more-complete Article 9
 (Definitions), which, as previously discussed, is best reviewed alongside of all the updated
 articles. All graphics will be updated in accordance with discussions with the Council. At that
 point, the entire Chapter will be almost ready for release, waiting for final guidance from the
 Council.
- Deadlines for entering reports into Granicus require, for the report to be on time, that this
 update of all Articles be completed no later than the week of May 22nd, as the packet needs
 to be sent to the Council no later than May 30. Updating all the Articles in the three weeks

between May 1st and the week of May 22nd will be a challenge, but staff will aspire to achieve it.

Staff anticipates that the Council will wish to have two Conference Sessions to discuss the entire document, and therefore suggests both June 5th and June 12th. If the Council wishes further discussion, a Conference Session could be held either in a special meeting (for example, on June 9th or June 16th) or on June 20th after the regular meeting.

After this final guidance, staff would update the entire document so that, at a regular meeting, the Council can vote to set the public hearing dates and formally refer the document to the Planning Commission. Staff anticipates these votes to take place on July 10th, the last meeting before the summer break.

An advantage of this approach is that staff could then use the summer break to engage with the public and educate them about the contents of the draft, so that they are more able to provide informed testimony. While it is likely that many people will be on vacation, staff will provide multiple opportunities both in person and online for citizens to engage when they are available.

Public Hearings

Staff remains committed to providing the Council the opportunity to adopt the new zoning regulations during 2023. To do so, staff recommends that the public hearings be set as early as possible after the summer break. As will be seen below, it will be challenging to the complete the project in the targeted time even with those early dates.

As a reminder, the plan has been for there to be two public hearings, held jointly with the Town Council and the Planning Commission. One public hearing would be at a normal Town Council Monday meeting, and one would be at a normal Planning Commission Wednesday meeting.

Staff recommends that the dates for public hearings that provide the highest likelihood of adoption during 2023 are **Monday**, **April 28**th **and Wednesday**, **April 30**th. The Council and the Planning Commission could choose to keep the public record for written comments open for longer, such as an extra week, for those who are unable or do not wish to attend the hearings.

From Public Hearings to Adoption – The Challenge

Staff views there to be two possible date goals that the Council could set for adoption:

- 1) Before the end of October (last meeting is October 23rd), or
- 2) Before the end of 2023 (last meeting is December 4th)

The attached calendar presents a timeline that permits completion by *October 23rd*. This timeline is *very* tight. To adopt on that date, the Council will need to vote to advertise its intent to adopt at the prior Town Council meeting, which is October 2nd. (Staff offers an alternative on the attached calendar of a special Town Council meeting on Tuesday, October 10th, to give the Council and staff an extra week.)

Staff apologizes in advance for the complexity of what is to follow, but it explains how staff arrived at what is on the attached draft calendar.

To meet the requirements of reports for the October 2nd date, staff needs to have updated the complete document with Council's direction by no later than September 22nd. Therefore, the last possible guidance from the Council will need to have come from the September 18th Conference Session. By that time, the Council will have needed to consider the public testimony and the Planning Commission's input (If a special October 10th meeting is scheduled, the Council would have an extra week in September to complete this work.)

A current limitation is that there is only one Council meeting (September 11th) and one Conference Session (September 18th) before the packet deadline for the October 2nd meeting. Staff anticipates that the Council will want to have more time for discussion, especially if the Council still wishes to have a joint Conference/Work Session of the Town Council and Planning Commission.

Staff therefore suggests the possibility of a special meeting on September 15th (or any other date that week or earlier). That date is shown in yellow on the calendar. If the Council were to add October 10th as a special meeting to vote on the intent to adopt, a special Conference Session on September 22nd and a Conference Session after the regularly scheduled September 25th meeting would provide more discussion time. Staff would then have until September 29th to update the draft. (Staff recognizes that any large-scale changes made on September 22nd or 25th would be difficult to implement by September 29th.)

With this extended time, the September 18th Conference Session could be used, at least in part, for a joint Conference/Work Session of the Town Council and Planning Commission, to discuss the Planning Commission's input and the public testimony that they both would have heard. Otherwise, staff is having trouble finding an appropriate time for this joint Conference/Work Session.

Extending the Work Past October

Staff has not projected any Code Create Conference Sessions or Meetings beyond October. The Council may wish to discuss whether those months should be included to reach final adoption by the end of 2023.

Conclusion

Staff recognizes the difficulty of this timeline and would welcome any creative ideas from the Council.
