Proposed Ordinance Changes

Sec. 18-248. - Protest against proposed change.

In case of a protest against any change of zone boundaries or rezoning of property signed by 20 50 percent, or more, of any one of the following groups:

- (1) The owners of lots included within the area of the proposed change;
- (2) The owners of lots abutting the area included in such proposed change; and
- (3) The owners of lots directly opposite the area included in such proposed change, where such area abuts upon a street;

<u>Such change shall not become effective except by a favorable two-thirds vote of six sevenths the Town Council quorum present.</u>

For purposes of this section, a protest petition must be submitted in writing and received by the Town Clerk no later than 12 o'clock noon on the last working day on which a public hearing on the application or motion is first conducted by the town council. The owners of any lots submitting any such protest petition shall execute such protest petition under oath that they are the legal owner or authorized representative of any such lot owner. If the owner of any lot is a corporation or condominium, the petitioner shall submit the appropriate documentation demonstrating he/she is the authorized representative for the lot owner.
