We actually use the consent agenda at every regular meeting.

So the guidelines we use for consent loosely are:

Below \$200,000

Administrative actions such as selling a cemetery plot, resolutions of support or authorizing the CM to move forward or execute a document.

Introductions of Ordinances (our ordinance approval is a two-meeting process – introduce the first meeting and then PH the second meeting)

Approval of Agreements, MOUs that are annual or noncontroversial

Award of a contracts that are annual or noncontroversial

Introductions of supplemental appropriations (same steps as the Ordinance approval)

So on our agendas the consent agenda is always listed whether there are items under it or not(we rarely have no items under it). And even if we have only one item for consent, we still place it under consent, and the reason for that is because anything on the consent agenda does not require staff to get up and give a presentation. I have had council ask the question, "if we only have one item why don't we just list that one item?" and the reason is because we don't have discussion or presentations of consent items. If we wouldn't normally provide a presentation on an MOU, why would we, just because it's the only item listed....that's just wasting peoples time. The Council always has the option to pull items from the consent agenda and then those items are provided discussion and presentation by staff following the approval of the remaining consent items.
