Good afternoon,

We are sending this email in response to Michael Gallagher's pedestrian improvement letter. We are 100 percent in favor of adding sidewalks throughout all of the neighborhoods in the Town of Vienna, including our own street, Cherry St, SW.

We have a new sidewalk in front of our home, 204 Cherry St, SW, which was completed by our builder during construction. Cherry St, SW is very often used as a cut through by commuters using Waze, parents dropping their children off at the Tiny Tots location at the corner of Cherry St, SW/Courthouse Rd as well as a large number of construction trucks and vehicles. Many of the children on our street, including our own child, are all walkers attending Vienna Elementary School. Having all of this cut through traffic with no sidewalks for our children to safely walk to school is very disconcerting and worrisome to say the least.

Sidewalks would drastically improve the safety of our street for our children and pedestrians alike. The lack of sidewalks throughout neighborhoods in Vienna has always presented challenges for safely walking your dog as well, speaking from experience.

We moved to Vienna from Arlington a little over three years ago where the majority of neighborhoods have sidewalks on one or both sides of the streets. We lived through several pedestrian improvement projects during our time in Arlington and the end result was always positive. Sidewalks not only improve pedestrian safety, but they will help to increase walkability to the businesses in our community.

While many homeowners may find the construction portion of a sidewalk installation very inconvenient and daunting, the end result for improved pedestrian safety, especially for our children is well worth the short term inconvenience during construction process.
